


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The Creator's Signature

- All elements serve a function and are in place for optimal fulfillment of purpose

EPHESUS	Capital of Asia, second in influence after Rome	Community of small groups, roles serve in a partnership	Evangelist (Timothy), elders, teachers and deacons (<i>Acts</i> , <i>Ephesians</i> , <i>1-2 Timothy</i>)
CORINTH	Town meeting, rule by the people	A loosely structured collection of home meetings	Prophets, teachers, laborers, administrators, healers, and other gifts (1-2 Corinthians)
ROME	Only authorized religions can organize	Constellation of churches in homes, very decentralized	Multiple small groups enhanced by prophecy , serving , teaching , encouraging , giving , leading , and showing mercy (<i>Romans</i>)

Romans 12:4-8

For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

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Scriptures on the Body of Christ



1 Corinthians 12:18-27



God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor.



1 Corinthians 12:18-27



And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.

Colossians 1:15-18

The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy.



Colossians 2:18-19

Do not let **anyone who delights in false humility** and the worship of angels disqualify you. Such a person also goes into great detail about what they have seen; they are puffed up with idle notions by their unspiritual mind. They have **lost connection with the head, from whom the whole body, supported and held together by its ligaments and sinews**, grows as God causes it to grow.


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Scriptures on the Body of Christ

So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip (*katartizo*) his people for works of service, **so that the body of**Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.






Ephesians 4:11-16

Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.



Problem Accumulation in Stuck Communities






- Rooted in monarchy and military
- Consolidates power and influence
- Lack of tethering of top leader
- Good top figures have greater risks
- Church reflects tastes of the few, becoming homogenous
- The deciders won't have sufficient perspective without significant effort
- Often leads to rankism, siloing, good boys club, inequities, etc.
- Communication easily breaks down
- Personality often trumps principle

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


